## CCS supporters offer a lifeline to children & families impacted by Covid-19

**Thanks to your kind support, the Catholic Children's Society (CCS) is continuing to help vulnerable children and families through the pandemic.**

Many families have experienced unprecedented challenges this winter. Families who have never faced financial difficulties before have found themselves at breaking point due to Covid. Those impacted by job losses and illness have been left unable to heat their homes, buy warm clothing or feed their children.

Thankfully, CCS supporters have helped thousands of vulnerable families and offered hope to those in desperate situations.

Through our Crisis Fund, we have been able to provide immediate financial support for over 4,900 children and parents/carers.

At Christmas CCS supporters also donated gift cards and supermarket vouchers to over 1,000 children and young people. This generosity brought much needed happiness to families facing an uncertain future.

## Helping families in crisis – James' Story



James' wife died three years ago leaving him to bring up their three young daughters alone. He has worked hard as a barber for many years and finally opened his own shop in February 2020. Then Coronavirus struck. His shop had to close and, as a new business, it wasn't eligible for any government support.

James had some savings, but these were quickly eaten up supporting his children and paying the rent and bills. Every month got harder and by January he could just about cover the rent but had no money left to heat the house or buy food for his children.

Increasingly desperate and with no family or friends to turn to, James did not know what to do or where to go for support.

James called his children's school to explain what was happening. The children's Headteacher immediately contacted CCS and we were able to help the family buy food and heat their home over the winter months.

***"After getting this help I feel like I can finally breathe. It has been the push I needed to keep me going."***

# Helping children cope with grief and loss during the pandemic

**Since September we have trained over 40 schools to deliver the Rainbows Bereavement Support Programme.**

Sadly demand for this programme has increased dramatically during the pandemic. Many children have lost parents, grandparents or other family members and are finding coping with this grief whilst being isolated at home extremely challenging.

Family breakdown is also a growing concern, with many children seeing their parents separate due to the pressures of the pandemic. This sense of loss can feel overwhelming for children.

Our Rainbows training will ensure school staff have the skills and expertise to provide structured support groups for children who have experienced these losses. These groups offer important early intervention support,



helping vulnerable children process their grief, feel less alone and develop greater resilience.

Feedback from schools has been extremely positive. One teacher said:

***“This programme will make a huge difference to our young people who have experienced tragic losses in recent months. Thank you for this vital training.”***

# Enabling young people to access online learning

**We have been able to help disadvantaged young people continue their education throughout the pandemic.**

Thousands of young people have been unable to access online learning during school closures. Although some devices had been given out by the government, many children and young people were left without any way to attend online lessons or complete work. This has put children living in poverty at a huge disadvantage.

Thankfully we were able to secure funding for over 100 laptops which have been distributed to disadvantaged young people across London. Families were incredibly grateful for this support:
