Alex was born with a heart condition and has had many operations throughout his life.


Last year, Alex was told that he would need a major operation on his heart. It would take two months for Alex to recover from the operation- one month in the hospital and one month at home.





Alex's mum works in an office. Her manager told her that she could take the two months off to look after Alex, but she would not be paid.

Alex's mum did not know what to do. She needed to look after her son but if she didn't work, she wouldn't be able to pay the family's rent for their flat. The family could be evicted and lose their home.





Alex's teacher contacted the Catholic Children's Society to see if they could help.

Within 24 hours, the Catholic Children's Society gave Alex's mum the money she needed to pay the family's rent for two months.

Now the family can keep their home and Alex's mum can focus on caring for her son.






Marla is seven years old and lives with her mum.






Joseph is 10 years old and lives with his grandparents.






Holly is eight years old and lives in London with her mum and two-year-old sister.

Holly's family had lived in their flat for three years. One day the landlord came to the flat and told Holly's mum that she would have to leave the flat within a week.


Holly's family had nowhere to go and no family or friends to turn to.
