When Noah's family found themselves in a devastating situation, supporters of the Catholic Children's Society (CCS) offered them a lifeline.

Noah's Story

Noah is three-years-old and lives with his mum, dad and one-year-old sister.

Earlier this year the family faced the most traumatic time in their lives. Noah's dad was made redundant due to Covid-19 and in the same week, Noah was diagnosed with a brain tumour. Noah was immediately admitted to a children's hospital to undergo surgery and start chemotherapy.

The parents were distraught whilst also under huge stress worrying about how they would feed their children and keep their home. They prioritised paying their rent and covering the high travel costs to and from hospital to visit Noah, but had nothing left to pay bills or buy food.

Not knowing what they could do or who to ask for help, Noah's parents spoke to their local Parish Priest. The Priest got in touch with CCS and asked if we could support the family during this difficult time.

CCS were able to fund food and essentials and cover bills for two months whilst Noah was in hospital. This was a huge relief for the family and meant that Noah's parents could fully focus on caring for their son.

Noah has now completed chemotherapy and is recovering well at home with his family. He is even well enough to play in the park with his little sister.

Noah's dad has just found employment as a delivery driver and is extremely grateful that he can once again support his family.
