Ollie's Story




Ollie is seven year's old and lives with his mum and younger sister.

A few months ago, Ollie's home had a roof leak and the flat became extremely damp.

Within a couple of months, the ceilings, walls and windows had become covered in black mould.







Ollie's mum was very worried and upset and didn't know who she could turn to. She called Ollie's school to see if they could help.





Ollie's school spoke with the council and the family were moved into a new flat.

The new flat was completely empty. Everything in their previous flat had to be destroyed because of the mould. With the rise of living costs, Ollie's mum couldn't afford to buy basic furniture for the flat. Ollie's school contacted CCS to see if we could help.





Using money from the Crisis Fund, the Catholic Children's Society helped the family buy basic furniture so they could move into the new flat that same week.

Ollie is now feeling much better and the family are safe and happy in their new home.
